

What is an American Classical Education?

In American Classical Education, students are taught to separate the true, the good, and the beautiful, fostering a love of lifelong learning and knowledge pursuit. At NEOCA, a Hillsdale College Curriculum School, the educational approach follows the Trivium – teaching grammar, logic, and rhetoric – and the Quadrivium – arithmetic geometry, music, and astronomy.

During elementary school, students will focus on memorizing and learning facts, emphasizing the grammar of each subject. In middle school, students become more curious, and the Classical style introduces logic to develop their reasoning skills. Moving into high school, where students develop a deeper understanding of self-perception, American Classical Education places emphasis on rhetoric, teaching students to write and present ideas persuasively and confidently.

This traditional education approach is centered around the pursuit of truth, goodness, and beauty, involving the study of Latin and empowering students to learn and think independently. This process unfolds like a journey of discovery, guiding students through different stages of cognitive development.

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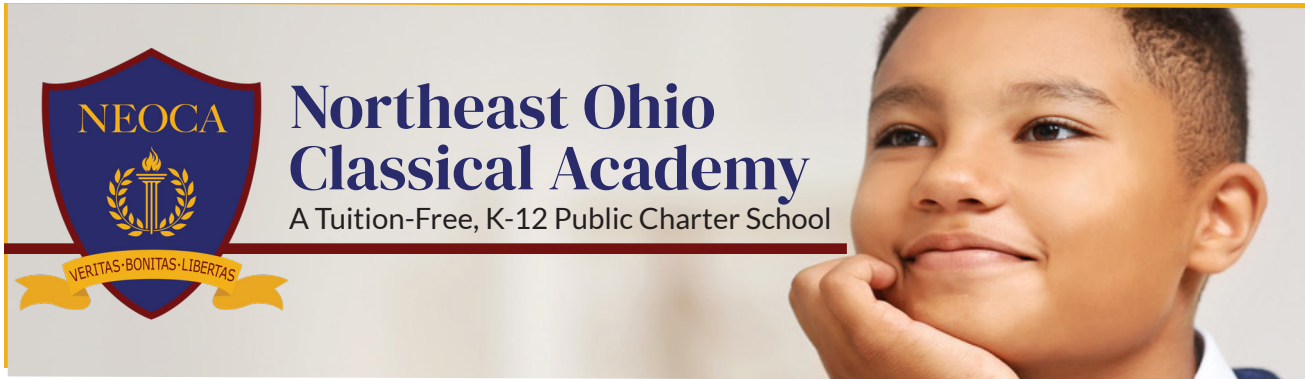

Key Characteristics of an American Classical Education

- A curriculum that is content-rich, balanced, and strong across the four disciplines of math, science, literature, and history
- Instruction in the Western tradition through history, literature, philosophy, and the fine arts
- Study of the American literary, moral, philosophical, political, and historical traditions
- Explicit instruction in phonics and grammar
- The study of Latin as a requirement for all students K-6 and above
- An approach to instruction that acknowledges objective standards of correctness, logic, beauty, weightiness, and truth
- Well-educated and articulate teachers who use traditional, teacher-led methods of instruction
- A commitment to use technology effectively without diminishing the faculty leadership that is crucial to academic achievement
- A plan to serve Grades K through 12, opening with lower grades initially to provide continuity and recurrent examination of subjects as the school expands grade at a time
- A school culture of moral virtue, decorum, respect, discipline, and studiousness among both students and faculty
